Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, and said to him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus."

- John 12:20-21

The Gospel doesn't reveal whether the Greeks succeeded in their quest or not, except to note that to see Jesus, one must follow him and be a servant to others. In that spirit, Christ belongs to the world. There is more than one picture of the Lord. Because in the Gospel account again, Jesus said, *Whoever loves me will keep my word, and our God will love them and we will come to them and make our home with them. (14:23).*

Kenny Loggins' children's song makes the point: "Some children see him lily white... Some him bronzed and brown... Some children see him almond-eyed... Some see him dark as they... The children in each diff'rent place will see the baby Jesus' face, like theirs, but bright with heavenly grace."

When the Detroit Institute of Art announced its exhibition of the Rembrandt portraits of the Head of Christ, it portrayed Rembrandt as a ground-breaking artist who brought new dimensions into view. As the first western-culture artist to portray Jesus as a Mediterranean Jew, he defied convention, but gave the world a truer view of Jesus.

The DIA exhibit is phenomenal and inspiring. Rembrandt's masterpieces are surely worth the price of admission; yet not because the artist has somehow created a more photographic representation of Jesus

for the world. The mastery is in the heart, mind and spirit of Christ, as portrayed in Rembrandt's pieces.

Take a moment, try your hand at drawing an eye. Can you make it look sad or angry or full of joy? Can you draw hands that invite others into peace or into an embrace of love? Can you make a furrowed brow look intensely intelligent, or the tilt of the head become compassionate?

With a few strokes of the hand with charcoal or a pen, Rembrandt could do all this. And bringing his portraits of Jesus back to the greater truth of Jesus' Middle Eastern heritage, he reminded the world that the love of God revealed in Christ transcended European culture.

That ground-breaking paradigm shift reminded the world that the Christ of faith can be witnessed in all kinds of cultural expressions that lift up Jesus' spirit. No matter what the image, it is true to life when Christ is portrayed reaching out to care.

Yet there is no more important representation of Jesus Christ, than for his spirit to come to life. There is no greater testimony to the gospel of Jesus Christ than for others to see Christ in us, with eyes that express our care, hands that work for peace, hearts that turn over in compassion, minds that seek reconciliation, and words and deeds that share love.

May we, dear friends, help be an answer to the timeless desire, "We wish to see Jesus."

The Sanctuary Choir will sing at the 9 AM service. And our CrossWords Band will perform at 11 AM.

Wednesday, February 22 *Ash Wednesday Worship 7:30 PM*

Join us for our traditional observance with which to enter the Lenten Season. This is a quiet and reverent time for reflection and spiritual renewal. The imposition of ashes will be offered. The Lord's Supper will be served. Rev. Wheeler's sermon is called, *Blessed Are The Merciful*. The Sanctuary Choir will lift up an anthem during the service.

Sunday, February 26 *First Sunday In Lent*

Our congregation written Lenten Devotional focuses on the teachings of Jesus. Those often startling and challenging, but beautiful teachings have parallels in our own First Congregational Church core values. Our Lenten worship will help us connect these two with reflections and faith practices. Rev. Wheeler will offer the first sermon on the themes called, *The Cost of Discipleship*. The Sanctuary Choir will sing at the 9 AM service. CrossWords will perform at 11 AM.

Below is a brief review of the Jan 22, 2012 congregational meeting attended by 61 congregational members.

The meeting was called to order at 1:01 PM by Abbie Goerg, the Moderator of our Lay Leadership Group. She offered thanks to the PRIDE group who hosted and provided our lunch. Attendees then participated in a prayer exercise which focused on "Where is God calling First Congregational Church this new year?"

Lisa Young, Vice-Moderator, informed the congregation that open positions on our Lay Leadership Group (one spot) and the Board of Trustees (two) still need to be filled. Nominations for yourself or someone else can be given to Lisa Young or Abbie Goerg for vote by the congregation at the next congregational meeting in March 2012. (tentative date set for March 18, 2012)

New business:

A Capital Stewardship Journey update was given by Kathy Campbell, BOT chair – Numbers are on P. 5 of this Post.

The Board of Trustees presented the need for a change in our by-laws regarding the sale of property given to the church; particularly in light of State of Michigan property statutes. Some discussion followed. Kathy Campbell, David Campbell, and Russ Menko represented the Board of Trustees. Questions and concerns were expressed and addressed. This will be addressed further at the March, 2012 meeting.

Karen Mitchell, LLG member, briefly reviewed the results gathered from the lunchtime tabletop discussions which featured a questionnaire about the FCC Core Values. We looked at which core values we felt are our strengths and which ones could use more attention in the future. Further explanation and more specific results will be offered at a later date by LLG, hopefully in next month's Parish Post!

The congregation was led in singing "Here I Am, Lord" by Lisa Young on the piano.

A closing prayer was offered by Abbie Goerg, LLG Moderator with meeting adjournment at 1:54 pm.

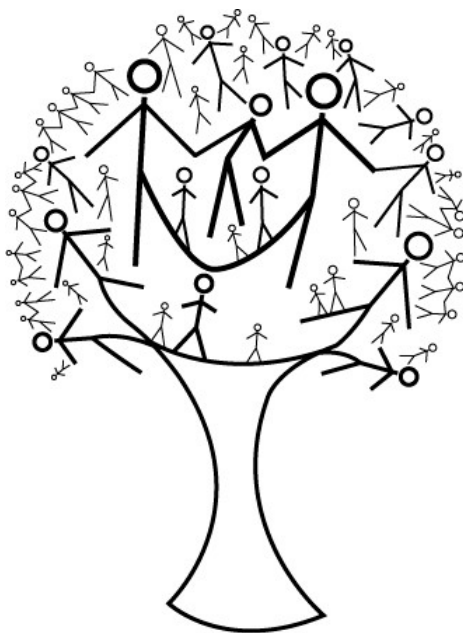

We are finalizing the process in replacing our **heat exchanger** which supplies hot water to the whole building. It's a very sensitive piece of equipment! And additional repairs were required on our **boiler** this month. AND we've had a new **dry well** installed at the north end of the building. We continue to give thanks to Don Bishop, Boris Usztan and Keith Hartley for staying on top of these challenging projects.

The Board has been working on our **Building Use Policy**. After having it in place for a year or so, it was time to review our processes and adjust the policy to recognize how our ministries, members and community groups have actually been requesting, reserving and contracting for the building use. We plan to simplify!

Looking forward to spring, we will begin work on **Stewardship** and our budgeting process for presentation at the June annual meeting. We continue to give thanks for the **Capital Stewardship Journey** and the most wonderful presentation of early gifts. These funds have been able to provide the resources we needed to do the work we outlined above as well as make major additional payments to our mortgage. Thank you!

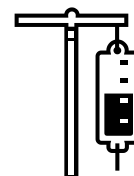

Parents and other adults (known as monitors) assist the student staff to keep it so. Some people volunteer weekly and others do it sporadically (one evening a month or so).


